Pardon Sought for Jack Johnson

Boxer convicted over relationship in 1913

(AP) - Congress is urging a presidential pardon for Jack Johnson, the first black heavyweight champion who was convicted in 1913 in a case based on his consensual relationship with a white woman.

"No one should be punished for choosing to go their own way," said Sen. John McCain, R-Ariz., who has led the effort in Congress to pass legislation for a pardon.

Johnson became the champion in 1908 and was convicted under a law that banned the interstate transport of women for immoral purposes.


Second Strike Turns Child Into Adult

Portland Police arrested 17-yearold Michael Anthony Canell on charges of a felon in possession of a firearm and unauthorized possession of a short-barreled firearm while leaving the Youth Employment Institute on Broadway on Wednesday, April 6.

Although underage, Canell is now considered an adult offender because of a prior Measure 11 con-

Officers recovered the shotgun loaded with five rounds of ammunition at the time of his arrest. Oddly enough, officers were at the school at the time, attending a meeting on teen violence.

A subsequent investigation revealed that the shotgun may have passed between other individuals and may have been used in at least

no emotion and sat staring at the defense table as the sentence was handed down.

Prosecutors argued for the maximum sentence, saving Hale's crime amounted to an act of terrorism, and the judge agreed.

"Mr. Hale is not concerned about taking someone's life, but rather how to do it without getting caught," U.S. District Judge James Moody said in imposing the sentence. "I consider Mr. Hale to be extremely dangerous and the offense for which he was convicted to be extremely egregious."


