

### **Blazer Herm Gilliam Dead at 58 Championship Team Player Remembered**

Former Trail Blazer Herm Gilliam, who played on Portland's 1976-77 NBA Championship team, died Saturday at his home from a heart attack, the team said. He was 58.

Gilliam, a former player at Purdue and a guard on the Portland Trail Blazers' only NBA championship, lived in Portland. He played eight seasons in the NBA, averaging 10.8 points and 3.8 assists a game.

He played for Cincinnati, Buf-





land beat Philadelphia in six games that year to claim the NBA title.

Gilliam was the Cincinnati Royals' first-round draft pick, eighth overall, out of Purdue in 1969. He had seven points and 11 rebounds in the Boilermakers' 92-72 loss to UCLA in the 1969 NCAA championship game.

He averaged 15.9 points a game in three seasons at Purdue and was All-Big Ten as a senior in 1969.

#### **Robinson Honored** Dodgers celebrate 58 years of crossing color line

(AP) - No matter how many players pass through the Dodgers' clubhouse, Jackie Robinson will remain the heartbeat of an enduring and endearing franchise that was the first to integrate the major leagues.

That point was driven home at Dodger Stadium in Los Angeles on Friday night when Rachel Robinson, Jackie's widow, was on hand with daughter Sharon to mark the 58th anniversary of her husband's first major league game and the breaking of the color line.

Two "Jackie Robinson Day." logos with circumferences as large as the pitcher's mound were painted on the field. Adding to the significance of the occasion was the fact that this season marks the 50th anniversary of the Dodgers' only World Series title in Brooklyn.

The Dodgers took the field against the San Diego Padres in replicas of the old road uniforms with "Brooklyn" spelled out. And transported back to baseball's Golden Era, when Robinson crowdof 25,623.




