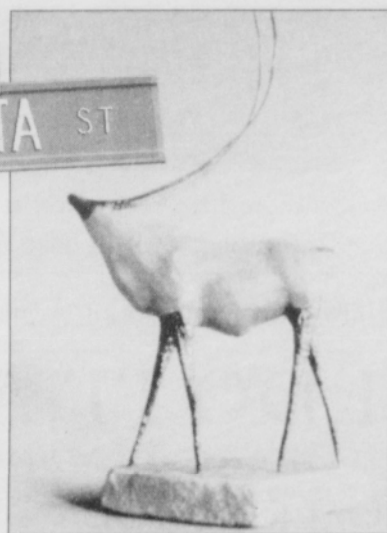

## Oil, Metal Artists Featured

The Guardino Gallery, 2939 N.E. Alberta, will feature two artists this month featuring fabricated metal sculptors and landscape oil paintings.

Rick Gregg's metal sculptors portray animals and abstracted forms. With a background in blacksmithing and fabrication, he uses torches to sculpt beyond normal boundaries of heating, bending and welding to push the metal with

the flame in the way sculptors would move clay with their thumbs.

Michael Southern will be showing a selection of his most recent landscapes. Painting with oil on woods, he's drawn to bold natural colors connected to the outdoors.

A reception for both artists is scheduled May 26 from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m. during the Last Thursday Art Walk on Alberta.

## World Sounds at Children's Museum

The Portland Children's Museum, 4015 S.W. Canyon Rd., across from the Oregon Zoo, is offering a celebration of the music, words and rhythms of world cultures each Sunday through June 26.

The WorldSounds series is presented by the Spirit Mountain Community Fund and showcases musicians, dancers and storytellers from traditions as diverse as Eastern European Klezmer and Northwest Native American to Caribbean calypso.

Show times are 1 p.m. and 3 p.m. except when noted in the museum's Imagination Theater. Tickets are free with museum admission.

On May 22, Harold Paul and Family will perform Native American cultural songs, dance, and traditions. On May 29, Nava presents Mexican songs and games. On June 5, Portland Taiko, the award-winning Asian American drumming ensemble.

On June 12, Viva La Cultura brings its vivid retelling of Native American, Mexican and Cuban folktales through theater, music, song and movement. On June 19, Lions of Batucada, a marching percussion ensemble will play African-influenced dance music of Brazil. On June 26, Maria del Rey performs children's songs and stories from Latin America.

## 'Gilligan's Island' Gains Diversity

(AP)—"Gilligan's Island" is getting a little diversity. Tiy-E Muhammad, 35, a psychology and human sexuality professor from Atlanta, stars as one of the Professors in the upcoming second installment of TBS' "The Real Gilligan's Island," which premieres June 8.

"A black person on 'Gilligan's Island'? I think the only other time they had a black person on there was the Globetrotters," Muhammad said. (The Harlem Globetrotters visited the island in a 1981 TV movie.)

In the reality-show take on the '60s stranded-on-an-uncharted-island sitcom, two real-life versions of the "Gilligan's Island" crew live together in a village reminiscent of the CBS show
