Villaraigosa Wins L.A. Mayor's Race


Confirms rising political power of Latinos

(AP) -Los Angeles Councilman Antonio Villaraigosa unseated Mayor James Hahn May 17 to become the city's first Hispanic mayor in more than a century, confirming the rising political power of Latinos in the nation's second-largest city.

After a lackluster term tainted by corruption allegations at City Hall, Hahn was turned out of office in favor of a high school dropout and son of the barrio who turned his life around to become speaker of the California Assembly and then a member of the Los Angeles City Council.

With 82 percent of precincts reporting, Villaraigosa had 225,328 ers. votes, or 59 percent, to 158,732 votes for Hahn, or 41 percent.

Striding to the podium at his victory party amid chants of "Si, se puede," Spanish for "Yes, we can," Villaraigosa thanked his family and of the Western frontier. Hahn, the end Magic Johnson.

Venezuela Wants Cuban Exile Back

(AP) - Thousands of Venezuelans demonstrated Saturday as the government demanded the extradition of a Cuban exile Luis Posada Carriles, now being held by U.S. immigration authorities.

Posada is accused of plotting the 1976 bombing of a Cuban jet that killed 73 people.

Hundreds of President Hugo Chavez's supporters gathered in the historic Plaza Bolivar in Caracas, dancing to a band that sang one song urging the crowd to "fight against the protection of Luis Posada Carriles" by the United States.

Posada, who has denied wrongdoing, was being held without bond at a federal detention center in El Paso, Texas, while awaiting a hearing set for June 13.

Mexico's Fox asks Black Leaders for Support

(AP)-Mexico President Vicente Fox is asking U.S. black leaders to support a migration accord as part of efforts to ease tensions over comments he made more than a week ago that were branded

Fox angered the U.S. government and black Americans on May 13 when he said that Mexican immigrants take jobs "not even" blacks want in the United States.

He defended his commitment to minorities and human rights on Sunday during an interview with civil rights activist Jesse Jackson on a U.S. radio program, in his first public response to his

controversial comment.

"I very much regret the misinterpretation," said Fox, touting laws created under his administration that outlaw discrimination and protect minorities.

Many Mexicans were at first puzzled by the outcry over Fox's comment, saying the president was justified in his reaction to new U.S. immigration policies that include extending walls along the border and cracking down on illegal migrants.

Frustration has grown in Mexico with the failure of the U.S. government to approve a migration accord widely promoted by President Bush.


