With school out for the summer and parents working, it's important for kids to know how to stay home safely by themselves, and how to care for their younger brothers and sisters.

The Red Cross will offer two workshops for the months ahead.

Formed for latchkey children, ages 8 to 11, "When I'm In Charge" gives kids safe options should they find themselves home alone. The class is targeted at enhancing self-reliance in preventing and preparing for emergencies, as well as phone, gun

and Internet safety. Workshops are going on until June 25 at various locations throughout the Portland metro area. The fee is \$18 with

Youth ages 11 to 15 can learn everything they need to know about being a great babysitter in "Babysitter's Training." The six-hour, 45-minute course covers: employment skills and business practices; leadership; decision making skills; safe play; and basic infant care including diapering and feeding. Students will also learn the first aid and safety skills needed to prevent, prepare for, and respond to emergencies. Workshops are held through June 30 on various local dates and locations. Fee is \$35.
