Useful Tips to Avoid Becoming an Identity Theft Victim

It's not uncommon to hear stories of fraud due to unauthorized use of an individual's personal information. his is known as identify theft. A close friend had his information stolen and it was a

nightmare. Within a week, the thieves ordered an expensive cell phone package, applied for a major credit card, received approval for a Gateway computer, made changes within the DMV online, and more.

Here are some helpful tips to prevent you from becoming a victim:

When writing checks to pay credit card bills, never put the complete account number on the "For" line. Instead, put the last four digits of the account number on the check. The credit card company knows the rest of the number. This prevents anyone who might be handling your check from accessing your credit card num-

Put your work phone number on your checks instead of your home phone. If you have a PO Box use that instead of your home address. If you don't have a PO Box, use your work address. Never have your social security number printed on your checks.

Photocopy both sides of every credit card, license, etc. in your wallet. You will know what you had in your wallet and all of the account numbers and phone numbers to call and cancel in the event of theft or loss. Keep the photocopy in a safe place. It's a good idea to carry a photocopy of your passport when traveling abroad.

We've been told we should cancel our credit cards immediately in the event your information or credit cards are stolen. But the key is having the toll free numbers and your card numbers handy so you know whom to call.

Immediately file a police report in the jurisdiction where your credit cards were stolen. This proves to credit providers you were diligent, and this is a first step towards an investigation if needed.

Place a fraud alert on your name and social security number. The fraud alert informs potential creditors that they must call you and receive verbal consent prior to opening an account in your name.

Local Plant to Produce Biodiesel

Will turn cooking oil into fuel for trucks and cars

Plans to start a local processing facility for Oregon's first commercial plant to turn used cooking oil into biodiesel are in place to start production in November.

SeQuential-Pacific — controlled by SeQuential Biofuels of Portland and Pacific Biodiesel of Kahului, Hawaii — said it has purchased an acre of industrial land at Kelley Point who represents northeast Portland. in north Portland.

The company said the plant would be capable of producing about 1 million gallons per year of biodiesel, made from cooking oil and usable as fuel in diesel engines.




