Should the successful bidder fail to enter into such contract and furnish satisfactory performance bond within the time stated in the specifications, the bid proposal deposit shall be forfeited to the Clark County Road Fund.

Transit Enhancement Projects: \$320,000 Section 5307 funds for refurbishments at various Park & Ride lots, transit centers and bus mall.
Preventive Maintenance: \$33,180,000 Section 5307, \$7,000,000 Section 5309FG and \$1,834,292 STP partial funding of TriMet's bus and rail maintenance costs for FY2006.
