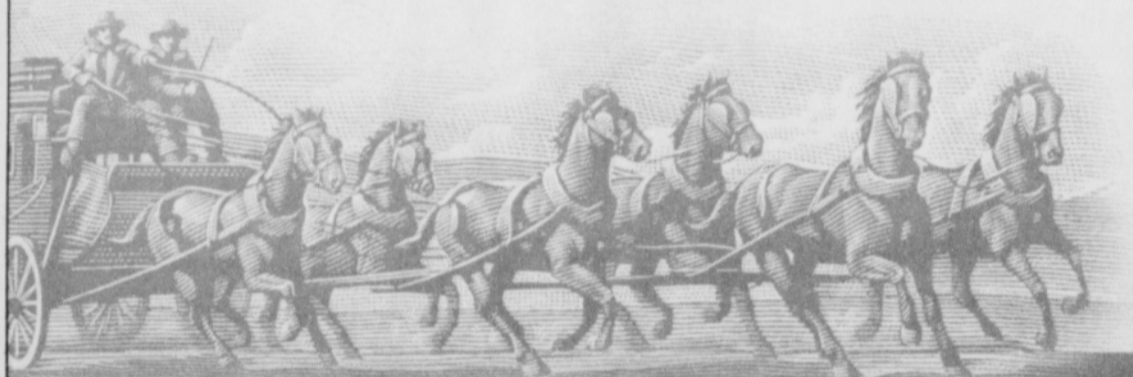

Housing Dreams Come True

Habitat for Humanity built on support

Wells Fargo is helping the dream of home ownership come true for 43 children and 20 adults in Gresham.

The Wells Fargo Housing Foundation presented a check for \$157,500 to Mt. Hood Habitat for Humanity Thursday, which is building a 14-family affordable housing development on one acre at 16842 S.E. Stark St.

The "Lillian's Place" development includes 14 condos (2-4 bedrooms each) and a community center. Construction began in January and is expected to be completed on time for the families to move in before the next school year. The project has an estimated value of \$1.7 million.

Wells Fargo team members have been helping build the project since the start. About 50 Wells Fargo volunteers were on site Thursday to paint, plant greenery and install wiring. The grant amount is based on the more than 2,480 volunteer hours that Wells Fargo team members and their friends and family members have worked on the project so far.

"With housing prices soaring in the Portland metro area, there is a huge demand for affordable housing for low- and moderate-income residents," said Meghan Mahaffy, executive director of Mt. Hood Habitat for Humanity. "Wells Fargo is helping us not only with a large contribution of money but also with an invaluable contribution of labor

to complete this development."

Habitat for Humanity seeks to eliminate poverty housing and homelessness. People of all backgrounds volunteer to build Habitat homes with families in need. The homes are sold to the families at no profit, financed with affordable, no-interest loans. The mortgage payments are used to build more homes.

Nonprofit Hosts Homeowner Workshops

The Portland Community Land Trust will host a series of upcoming events on homeownership throughout August.

The nonprofit, community organization safeguards land to provide affordable homeownership opportunities. Homes are sold to buyers with limited incomes at below market prices because the cost of the land is not part of the equation. In exchange for buying

their homes at a price they can afford, a land trust homeowner agrees to limit the price at which the home is resold, keeping the house permanently affordable for future generations.

PCLT Homeownership Orientation workshops will be held for free at the office on 3109B NE Broadway from 6 to 7 p.m. on Thursday, August 11 and Wednesday, August 31. An open

house for the PCLT condos, ranging in price from \$79,000 to \$96,000, will be held at 3911 NE Killingsworth on Sunday, August 28 from 1 to 4 p.m. The National Community Land Trust Conference will be held at Portland State University from August 17 to 19.
