## Man Killed Outside Bar

A 26-year-old Portland man was shot and killed outside a bar and restaurant in the 3900 block of North Vancouver Avenue.

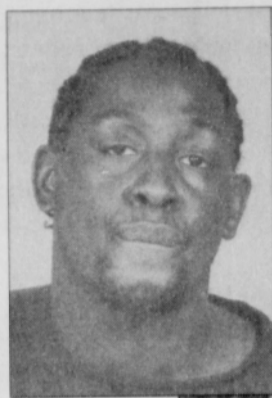
Eyo Nyong, was fatally wounded July 27 at 9:52 p.m., police said. An officer in the area heard shots fired in the area at the time.

An autopsy has determined that Nyong died of a gunshot wound to the head. Based on information from witnesses, detectives believe that Nyong while shot at least once

while he was talking with two suspects outside of the bar. The suspects fled the area on foot immediately after the shooting.

No arrests have been made.

## Bomb Plotter Sentenced to 22 Years

Man planned to blow up airport in Los Angeles

(AP) - An Algerian who plotted to bomb the Los Angeles airport on the eve of the millennium was sentenced to 22 years in prison by a Seattle federal judge who used the opportunity to sternly criticize the Bush administration's anti-terrorism tactics.

"We did not need to use a secret military tribunal, detain the defendant indefinitely as an enemy combatant or deny the de-

fendant the right to counsel," U.S. District Judge John C. Coughenour said. "The message

to the world from today's sentencing is that our courts have not abandoned our commitment to the ideals that set our nation apart."

The July 28 sentence against Ahmed Ressam was significantly lower than the 35 years recommended by prosecutors, but it could have been even shorter had Ressam agreed to testify against two of his alleged co-conspirators.

Ressam, 38, cooperated with the government for about two years, but had quit by 2003, claiming the many months of solitary confinement had taken their toll on his mental state.

Ressam was arrested in Port Angeles in December 1999 as he drove off a ferry from British Columbia with 124 pounds of bomb-making materials. Ressam had a one-night reservation for a hotel in Seattle, prompting the mayor to cancel New Year's Eve celebrations at the Space Needle.

After being convicted of terrorist conspiracy and explosives charges at his 2001 trial, Ressam began cooperating in hopes of winning a reduced sentence. He told investigators from several countries about the operation of terrorist camps and disclosed the identities of potential terrorists, the use of safe houses and other details.

## Suspect Sought in Fatal Shooting

The Portland Police, in cooperation with Crime Stoppers, need help solving a homicide.

On Jan. 21 at about 7:15 p.m. police responded to a shooting at a house in the 5900 block of Northeast Ninth Avenue. When they arrived, they found 25-year-old Tameka Renee Hartley on the porch of her house suffering from a gunshot wound to her chest. She was transported to a hospital, but died later that night.

Detectives believe Hartley was

on the porch, possibly with other people, at the time of the shooting. Multiple shots were fired from a vehicle driving by the house. Nobody else reported being injured.

Detectives are looking for information about a vehicle seen leaving the area. It was described as a small to medium sized dark colored sedan with tinted windows.

Crime Stoppers is offering a cash reward of up to \$1,000 for information. Calls may remain anonymous at 503-823-4357.

## 'Photographer' Wanted for Sexual Assault

Two incidences yield same suspect

On July 4, at approximately 1630 hours, a man approached a female pedestrian on SW Montgomery Street near Portland State University, and solicited her to be photographed. Detectives believe that the man from this incident is the same suspect involved in the sexual assault of a female pedestrian in an incident that occurred in April 2004, at a parking garage in downtown Portland. The suspect approached



Police rendering of rape suspect

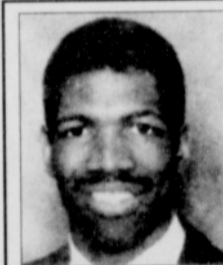
the women in a similar manner in both incidents. Both women were in their late teens.

The suspect is described as a white male, about 36 years old, approx. 5'8", heavy build ("pudgy" and "pear-shaped"), dark-blonde, short hair, "crystal" blue eyes, pointy nose, baby-face with fair complexion, clean-shaven, rosy cheeks and dark teeth. The suspect wore a T-shirt with thick stripes, Khaki cargo-style shorts, sneakers and gym socks.

At the time of the July 4th incident, the suspect was last seen driving a white 4-door sedan, older model with black molding and black

door handles.

## Auto Group Hit on Misleading Ads


For the second time in four years, Attorney General Hardy Myers has filed a court action against the Thomason Auto Group, one of the state's largest automobile dealerships, for misleading advertising and for circumventing the state's anti-bushings laws.

In the earlier case, Oregon Department of Justice staff found that the dealership advertised car sales through "spot" ads in the classified sections of many newspapers

and sold them to unsuspecting buyers for thousands more than the advertised price.

In March 2004, the Thomason Honda dealership in Gladstone advertised an offer in large, bold print of "35 PERCENT OFF MSRP (Manufacturer's Suggested Retail Price) ON ALL HONDAS IN STOCK!!" In very small type above the offer, the dealership posted "Dealer Installed Options Discounted."

The offer was clearly misleading, as the dealership soon discovered, as large numbers of angry customers arrived to buy a new Honda at a 35 percent reduction, only to find the discount was for dealer installed options. The dealership closed its doors early that day and remained closed the next day. More than 30 consumers filed complaints with Justice concerning the alleged fraudulent advertising.
