## Exhibit Sheds Light on Firehouses

Curious artists around Portland recently spent time among local firehouses, participating in and observing the daily grind of being a firefighter. What resulted is a large collection of artwork to be featured in "Intersections: Artists and Firefighters" at the Interstate Firehouse Cultural Center running Thursday, Sept. 8 through Oct. 27.

The show features the work of Jason Greene, Mary Josephson, Cynthia Lahti and Henk Pander in collaboration with the Regional Arts and Culture Council and Portland Fire and Rescue.

Observations and impressions were recorded with photographs, sketches, diary entries and a wealth

of personal memories. The artists then returned to their studios to create unique artworks based on their experiences.

Also on exhibit will be a collection of historic photographs from the archives of the Portland Bureau of Fire, Rescue and Emergency Services. The photos document the people, places, equipment, and teams of horses that represented the public persona of the firefighting force of a century ago.

The IFCC Gallery is open 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. Tuesdays through Fridays, and noon to 4 p.m. on Saturdays.
