and crazy white kids with Furry Lewis, Bukka White, Sleepy John Estes and Hill Country master Mississippi Fred McDowell.

Blue Watermelon celebrates the lives and legends of men who are their folk heroes. Through the filter of generations their blues becomes rock and roll.
