#### **Important** dates for signups ahead

Medicare will be offering new benefits soon, with coverage for preventative screenings and prescription drugs. Everyone with Medicare is eligible for this plan, regardless of income and resources, health status, or current prescription expenses.

Joining the new program is voluntary, with some important paperwork deadlines that are necessary to watch if you'd like to be involved

In October, a "Medicare and You Handbook" will be sent via mail, outlining details of prescription drug options. The first possible sign up date is Nov. 15, with coverage beginning by Jan. 1. May 15 will be the last day to join the plan. If you change your mind after the May 15 deadline and decide to join, a late enrollment fee will be added.
