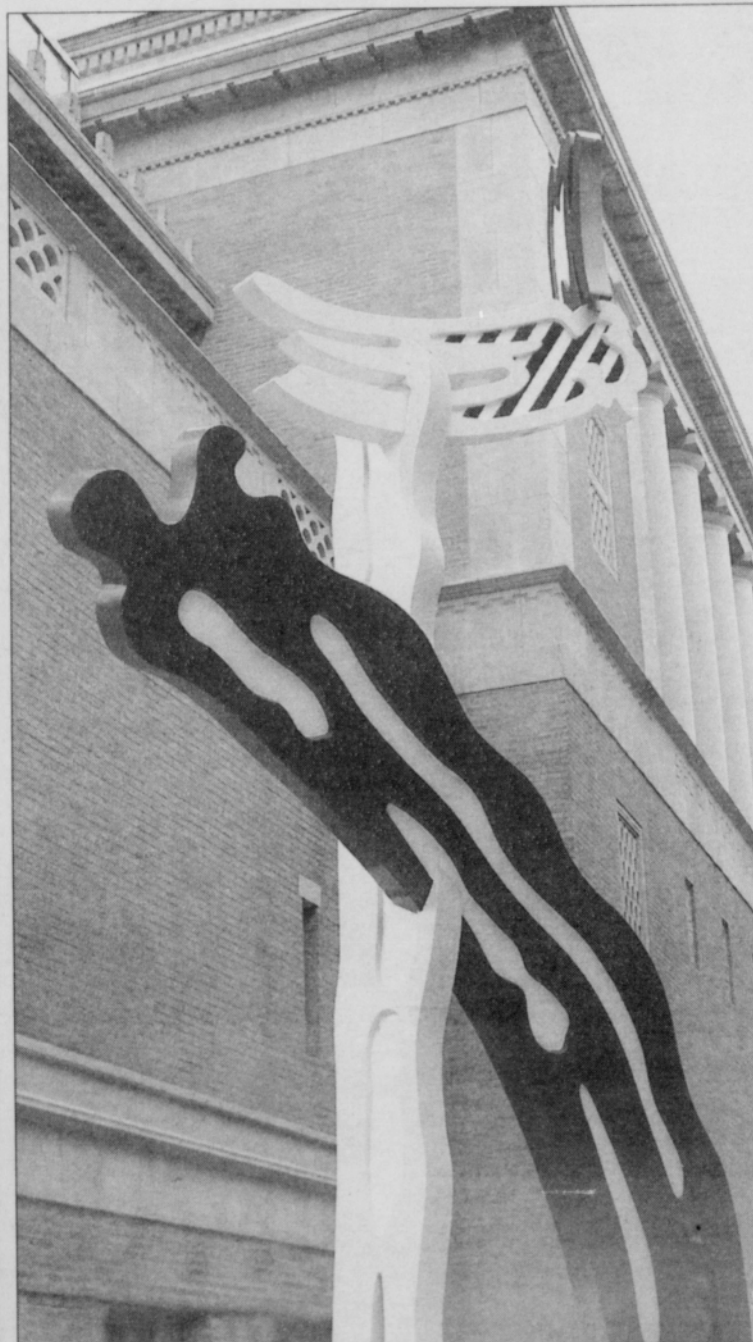

The Portland Art Museum is offering free admission through Sunday, Oct. 16 in celebration of the opening of the renovated Mark Building, the former Masonic Temple that is now part of the museum's exhibition space.

## Free Admission at Art Museum

Area residents can enjoy free admission to the Portland Art Museum through Sunday, Oct. 16 as it celebrates the grand opening of the Mark Building, the former Masonic Temple next door to its main exhibition hall at 1219 S.W. Park Ave.

Special events for the whole family are scheduled. The free admission to the museum includes not only the renovated temple, but extends to the Centers for Native American Art and Northwest Art,

as well as the museum's permanent collections of Asian, American, European, English silver, prints and contemporary art.

The Mark Building recently completed \$40 million in renovations, highlighted by 28,000 square feet of additional gallery space, two ballrooms and offices. The project was the culmination of a 10-year, \$125 million master plan for the restoration and expansion of the museum's 2.5-block campus.
