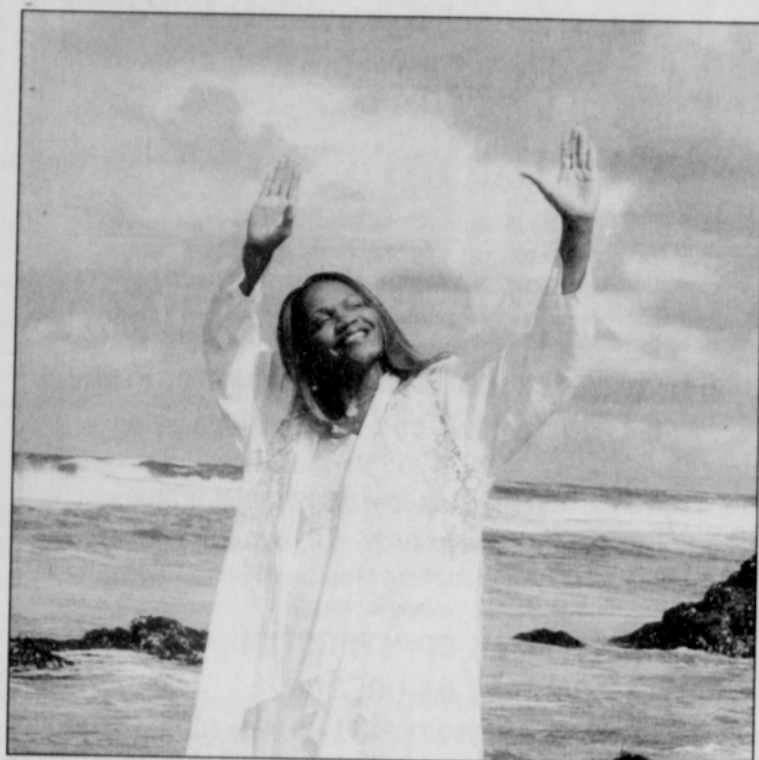

Gloria Stidum Performs Local Gospel Concert

Vocalist sings messages of love, diversity

Holiday Bazaar Celebrates 55 Years

Providence Child Center Guild features handmade crafts, gifts

Love is stitched into hundreds of handmade crafts and gifts that will fill the tables of the Providence Child Center Guild's 55th annual Holiday Bazaar, set for 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Friday, Nov. 11, in the main lobby of Providence Portland Medical Center, 4805 N.E. Glisan St.

This long tradition of the guild dates back to 1950, when the Sisters of Providence operated one of Oregon's first orphanages, Our Lady of Providence Nursery. The sisters cared for every child, regardless of where they came to their door. The guild formed initially to support the work of the orphanage.

"We were called 'mommas' by the children," said Eloise Savage, a 50-year guild member. "We would take the children out to stores when they needed new shoes or clothes. We took them out for ice cream. We took them to our homes for birthday parties and Halloween."

Savage's eyes twinkle as she recalls, "The sisters wanted the children to know there was another life out there - and we helped as best we could."

That charge from a half century ago still stands today. The orphanage closed in the

1960s when the state moved to a foster care system, but Providence continues to care for children with complex medical needs and profound disabilities at the Center for Medically Fragile Children.

Today the guild bazaar benefits the young residents at the center. The proceeds help give the children a childhood

by funding a variety of programs. The center is home to 58 children, and is the only facility of its kind in the Pacific Northwest.

In addition to the handmade items, guild members will offer a variety of baked goods, a traditional turkey luncheon and an Amish quilt raffle at the bazaar.
