Oregon has launched a "Network of Care," multilingual, community-based Website that provides comprehensive long-term care information and education to the thousands of seniors and persons with disabilities.

The Internet site is the first outcome of new legislation to "modernize" Oregon Project Independence, which provides the services necessary to keep seniors in their own homes and expand access to services to people with disabilities.

ofcare.org is designed to give seniors and their people with disabilities lead independent caregivers the ability to find the right service at

the right time, to educate themselves about the issues they care about, understand current policy initiatives and communicate directly to elected officials.

It also provides a comprehensive directory of service providers, easy-to-search libraries and vital information about specific disorders, pending legislation and advocacy, as well as daily news articles from around the world concerning aging and disabilities.
