

Holiday **Travel Tips**

Travelers heading over the mountains and through the woods for the holidays should make sure they're prepared for winter road conditions.

AAA Oregon urges motorists to use extreme caution as they take to the highways and to keep in mind some basic safety tips. People should get plenty of rest prior to taking a trip. Also, allow extra time to reach destination, carry emergency supplies like jumper cables, flares, flashlight, blanket and food.

If traveling through mountain passes, you should carry tire chains and know how to put them on. You can minimize driving distractions by putting pets in kennels and having games or books handy in order to keep kids entertained on the road. Also pull over to use cell phones, properly secure all vehicle occupants in their seats or safety seats, be patient, and do not drink and drive.

Flu Shot Delays Eased

County health departments and the Oregon Department of Human Services are trying to ensure that everyone who wants a flu shot can get one.

The agencies are working to redistribute vaccine to local providers who have short supplies and to areas of the state that have experienced vaccine delays.

Local health departments are creating lists of medical providers who need vaccine and matching them with other local providers who have vaccine to share.


