Children's Matinee Keeping Your Holidays Safe

Remembering electrical safety makes for happier holidays.

Pacific Power offers the following safety tips: Never use indoor lights outdoors and check electrical cords for frayed wires. Only use safety-tested lights and extension cords that carry the UL label. When using a ladder to hang lights outdoors, keep at least 10 feet away from any overhead power lines.

Never modify three-pronged plugs to fit two-pronged sockets and don't overload extension cords or outlets with too many plugs.

Test extension cords, if they're hot to the touch, it's likely a sign of a serious problem. Always turn off holiday lights when going to bed or leaving home. Never put extension cords under rugs, and keep them away from water, heat sources or metal pipes.

Keepamulti-purpose or "ABC" fire extinguisher in the home in case of electrical fire. Most importantly be careful with children around electrical outlets.




