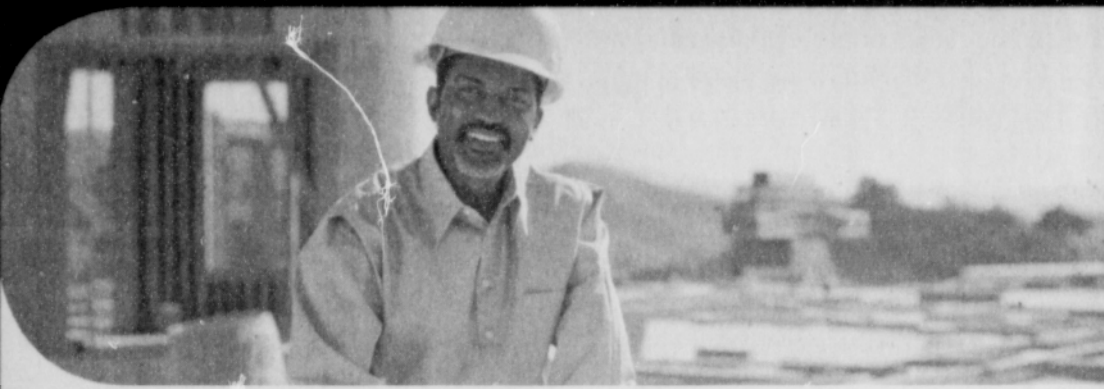

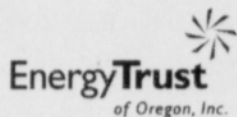

- **1987:** Parks founds the Rosa and Raymond Parks Institute for Self Development in Detroit, which offers career training for teenagers.
- **1988:** At age 75 Parks retires from her congressional duties.

• **1990:** Parks is called at the last moment to be part of the group welcoming Nelson Mandela, who had just been released from his imprisonment in South Africa. Upon spotting her in the reception line, Mandela calls out her name and, hugging her, says, "You sustained me while I was in prison all those years."



- **1994:** Parks received the Rosa Parks Peace Prize in Stockholm, Sweden.

• **Sept. 9, 1996:** President Clinton awards Parks the Presidential Medal of Freedom.

Rosa Parks was given many awards and accolades during the Clinton presidency. Parks is pictured here with activist, Cicily Tyson, and President Bill Clinton.

- **1998:** Parks becomes the first recipient of the International Freedom Conductor Award given by the National Underground Railroad Freedom Center.

• **June 15, 1999:** President Clinton awards Parks the Congressional Gold Medal of Honor, the nation's highest civilian honor.

• **December 8, 2003:** The U.S. Supreme Court ruled that Parks could proceed with her suit against hip-hop duo Outkast, who used her name without permission on a 1998 track.

• **Oct. 24, 2005:** Parks dies quietly in her apartment in Detroit only days before the 50th Anniversary of the Montgomery bus boycotts.
