In 1996, Darco added to her daunting workload when she became a welder for the City of Portland Parks and Recreation. With two jobs, her days began at three or four a.m., ending around midnight. She juggled both jobs for one year, but after a trip to Hawaii her body said she could no longer work 96-hour weeks.

"I had reached a crossroads. I was through proving myself to people," she said.

More than a decade after she dedicated countless hours to writing her bills, Darco said she would still like to see her legislation pass, but she's confident of the direction she has taken.

"If legislation started again I'd be there, but you have to choose your battles wisely," she said. "I try to choose my directions that will make the most difference for the future of our children."
