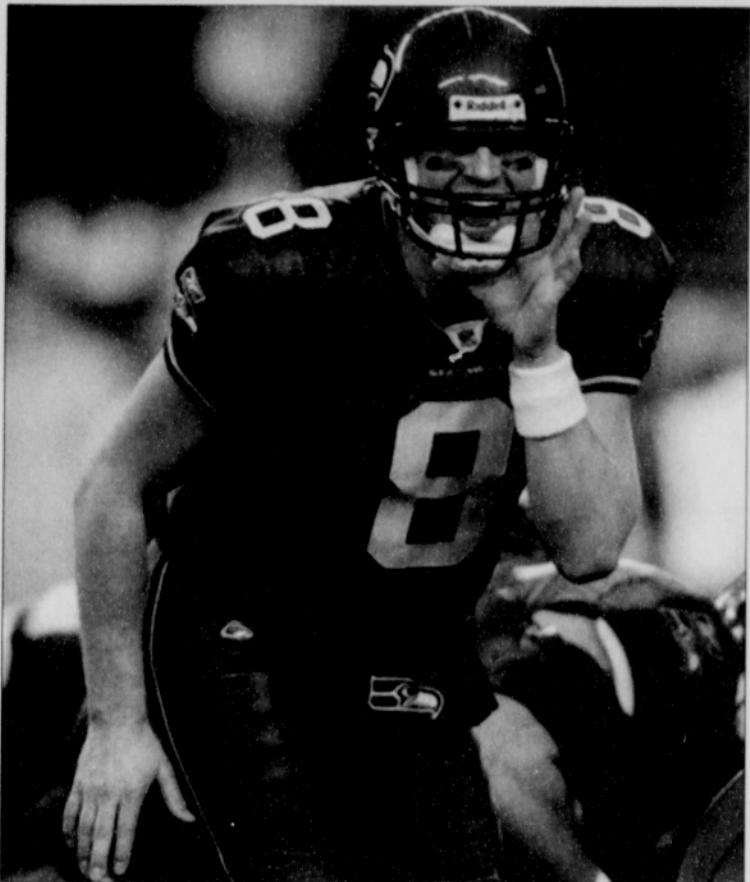


# Super Bowl XL



## Seattle Quarterback — Matt Hasselbeck

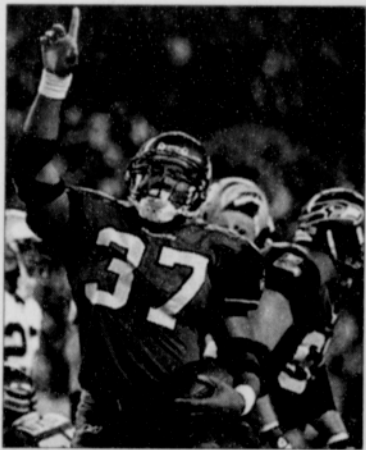
The NFL's Pro Bowl starting quarterback, Matt Hasselbeck finished the year with a 98.2 passer rating, good for fourth in the NFL. Yet nobody talks about just how good Matt Hasselbeck is. It's not as if he's a rookie, or that he's come out of nowhere; Hasselbeck has been starting for five years now, and the last four he's thrown for more than 3,000 yards and had a passer rating of at least 80.

**2005 Season Stats:** Passing — 294-of-449 for 3,459 yards; 24 touchdowns; nine interceptions; 24 sacks; 98.2 rating

## Seahawk Backfield Profile — Shaun Alexander

Shaun Alexander set an NFL record with 28 touchdowns and led the league in rushing with 1,880 yards. The six-year veteran has averaged more than 17 rushing touchdowns per season as a starter the last five years. He said he considered winning the MVP Award a group effort, further endearing him to fans and teammates.

**2005 Season Stats:** Rushing — 370 carries for 1,880 yards; 5.1 yard average carry; longest — 88 yards; 28 TDs; Receiving — 15 catches for 78 yards; 1 TD.



## Seahawks, Steelers Face Off Sunday

### Pittsburgh Steelers

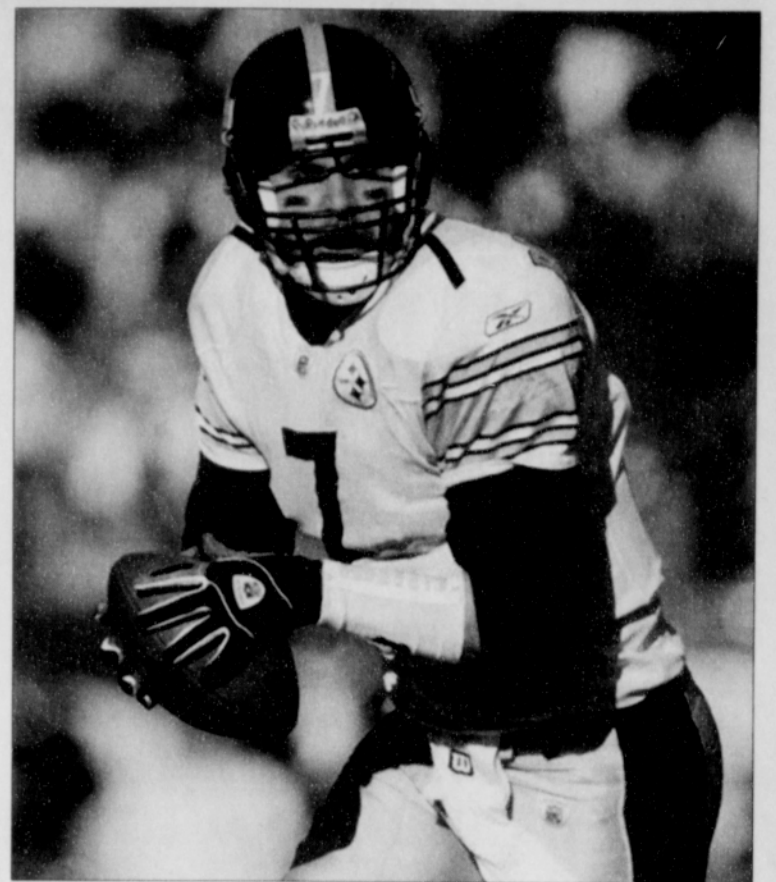
The Steelers, in the playoffs four of the last five years, will play in their Super Bowl since 1995.

**Season record:** 11-5  
**Overall playoff record:** 27-19  
**Last game:** Beat the Denver Broncos, 34-17, at Denver for the AFC title.  
**Momentum meter:** The Steelers are peaking just in time for the Big Game. As the first number six seed ever to reach the Super Bowl, Pittsburgh had to win three road games to get here. Prior to that, the team won four "must-win" games just to reach the playoffs.  
**Last Super Bowl:** Lost to Dallas 27-17 in Super Bowl XXX (1996)  
**Honors:** Guard Alan Faneca and strong safety Troy Polamalu were selected to the Pro Bowl.

### Seattle Seahawks

Winners of a franchise-best 13 games this season, the Seattle Seahawks will represent the NFC in this year's Super Bowl for the first time.

**Season record:** 13-3 Overall playoff record: 5-7  
**Last game:** Beat the Carolina Panthers, 34-14, at home for the NFC title.  
**Momentum meter:** The Seahawks kept their momentum going after a first round bye, picking-up two big wins at home to earn a trip to Detroit.  
**Last Super Bowl:** The Seahawks will be playing in the first Super Bowl in their franchise's history.  
**Honors:** Five players were selected for the Pro Bowl this year; running back Shaun Alexander, quarterback Matt Hasselbeck, fullback Mack Strong, guard Steve Hutchinson, and tackle Walter Jones will all start on offense for the NFC. Alexander was named NFL Most Valuable Player and Offensive Player of the Year in 2005.



## Pittsburgh Quarterback — Ben Roethlisberger

In his second season, Big Ben is 26-4 as an NFL starter, including the playoffs. He doesn't do it with big numbers; only twice in his career has he passed for 300 yards in a game. Instead, he does it with great accuracy. His career regular season completion percentage is a lofty 64.7 percent.

**2005 Season Stats:** Passing — 198-of-268 for 2,385 yards; 17 touchdowns; interception; 23 sacks; 98.6 rating



## Steelers Defensive Profile - Joey Porter

Linebacker Joey Porter talks a big game at times, but he can back it up, too. After jawing about the Colts and their plays, Porter recorded 1.5 sacks in the AFC Divisional Playoffs as Pittsburgh knocked Indianapolis out of the playoffs. Named to the All-Pro team in 2005, Porter tied career highs with 10.5 sacks and four forced fumbles. The Steelers had the AFC's top-ranked defense in 2005, allowing a paltry 284.0 yards of offense per game and just 4.6 yards of offense per play to their opponents.

## Queen of Soul to Reign Supreme

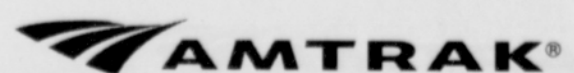
