Theater Students Confront Racism Foster climate of

equality, compassion

An innovative Portland Community College student group will tackle racism and other barriers for students in interactive theater performances.

The Illumination Project, a student leadership and education program designed to foster a climate of equality and compassion, is hosting performances designed to encourage audience participation.

Performances run from Thursday, Feb. 16 to March 6. They focus on problemsolving of issues that traditionally have made

access and retention in higher education more difficult for students of color, women, the poor and working class, immigrant and sexual minorities.

Stress Blamed in Leaving Chappelle Show

(AP) - Dave Chappelle told Oprah Winfrey he was stressed out and not crazy or on drugs when he abruptly left his hit Comedy Central show last spring during production.

In his first television interview since ditching "Chappelle's Show" in May, the comedian said that after he signed a \$50 million deal for the third and fourth seasons in August 2004, too many people were trying to control him and his show.

"I wasn't crazy but it is incredibly stressful," Chappelle, 32, said during his appearance on "The Oprah Winfrey Show" that aired

I felt in a lot of instances I was deliberately being put through stress because when you're a guy who generates money, people have a vested interested in controlling you," Chappelle said.

The status of his show has hung in limbo since May. Comedy Central announced in December that four half-hour episodes of "Chappelle's Show" will premiere in weekly airings this spring. A full season would have been between 10 and 13 episodes.
