Seniors and people with disabilities are being warned about of a telephone scam that asks Medicare ing account information to help them enroll in a Medicare Prescription Drug Plan.

This scheme is called the "\$299 talked into withdrawing from their





checking accounts to pay for a nonexistent prescription drug plan.

Consumers can report these beneficiaries for money and check- cases to their local law enforcement agencies to the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services at 1-877-772-3379.


