Ice Age: The Meltdown opens Friday







Flight 64, a non-profit cooperative dedicated to providing its members with a studio environment for the practice of printmaking, is located at Northeast 30th and Alberta, behind Bella Faccia.

Phegley will be exhibiting two new bodies of work both completed and in progress. The first, a series of woodcuts and etchings, deals with various emotional states as well as thoughts of escape via flying machines.
