

Tom's Fat Tuesday Band, a traditional New Orleans jazz, funk and R&B band will set the tone with 90 minutes of New Orleans party music. Devin Phillips and his New

Orleans Straight Ahead quartet will follow. Devin's band is the most sought-after jazz combo in town and has been featured regularly at local clubs including Jimmy Mak's, The Blue Monk and the Goodfoot Lounge.

NOLA2PDX succeeded in funneling over \$40,000 to the displaced New Orleans musicians, including over \$12,500 in direct fees for weekly performances on Mercy Stage at Billy Reed's and \$4,000 in fees at the Portland Jazz Festival.
