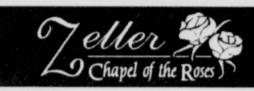

Sealed bids will be received on the fifth floor at the Housing Authority of Portland (HAP), 135 SW Ash, Portland, Oregon 97204, until 2:00 pm, Tuesday June 6, 2006 for labor and materials for work at Maple Mallory, a 48 unit complex located at 3719 NE Garfield Portland, Oregon 97212. Shortly thereafter, bids will be opened and publicly read. The First Tier Subcontractor List, HAP-421, must be received by 4:00 p.m. the same day. No bidder may withdraw their bid after the hour set for opening until after the lapse of sixty (60) days from the bid opening.

The basic work consists of complete interior remodel including: abatement of hazardous materials, carpentry, new kitchen and bathrooms, new cabinetry, new flooring, new mechanical, plumbing and electrical systems, new exterior siding and roofing. Work also includes: a new community building, concrete, site and landscaping

Alternate methods the bidder proposes to use in complying with this goal are subject to HAP review and approval prior to initiating the contract.

This contract is for a public work subject to the Davis-Bacon Act (40 U.S.C. 276a). No bid will be received or considered by HAP unless the bid contains a statement that the bidder will comply with the Davis-Bacon Act.

#### **Water Operations Mechanic Apprentice**

Water Operations Mechanic Apprentice work involves the installation and repair of water service lines and mechanisms. Water Operations Mechanic Apprentices have formal apprenticeship status and participate in a structured 6,000hour program involving classroom instruction, on-the-job training, self-study and job performance. Initially work is performed under close guidance but increasing independence is granted as employees gain skill and experience during the course of the apprenticeship. 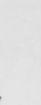

The Owner is the Oregon Military Department, Salem, Oregon. Proposers and their lower tier suppliers and subcontractors shall restrict their proposal phase communications to DBC, and shall not contact the Owner. Proposal period contact with the Architect and Engineers shall pre-approved by DBC representative Bob McDonald.

All proposals are to be submitted to Wildish Building Co. 3600 Wildish Lane, Eugene, OR, (if hand delivered) or P.O. Box 7428, Eugene, OR 97401, attention Bob McDonald.

Proposal documents shall be provided only upon request via email to bobm@wildish.com. E-mail shall include a proposer's title block with full corporate name, proposal contact person, corresponding address and e-mail address, telephone, fax, Oregon CCB number, and indicate "Mechanical" or "Electrical" proposer.

Documents shall be provided electronically by reply and in part by fax or mail.

Firms certified with the Oregon Office of Minority, Women, and Emerging Small Business are requested and encouraged to submit proposals.

Proposers shall be registered with the Oregon Construction Contractor's Board at the time of proposal submission.

Oregon BOLI Prevailing Wage Rates of July 2005 apply. Proposals must contain a statement that the Proposer will comply with the provisions of BOLI. Proposers must state whether or not they are a resident proposer, as defined in ORS 279.029 and must also state that the proposer will comply with all applicable state and federal laws when carrying out the contract.

All proposers must be "Equal Opportunity Employers" and comply with the appropriate provisions of state and federal law. In regards to Worker's Compensation, all proposers shall be required to comply with ORS 656.17 or are exempt under ORS 656.126.

Proposers shall be qualified to perform the type and size of work proposed. The DBC may determine that a proposer is unqualified based on the disqualifiers and/or pre-requisites listed within the proposal documents, or, at DBC's discretion, may waive minor aspects of the pre-requisites and disqualifiers.

Proposers shall be capable of providing a 100 percent performance and payment bond. Proposals shall be accompanied by a cashiers check, certified check, surety bond, or irrevocable letter of credit issued by an insured institution as defined in ORS 706.008 and payable to "Wildish Paving Co." in an amount of not less that ten percent (10%) of the amount of the proposal GMP.

DBC reserves the right to reject any or all proposals and to waive formalities. Proposals and proposal bonds are to remain in effect for 60 calendar days from date of proposal pending a written notice of intent to award. Proposals shall remain in effect thereafter until final execution of an agreement except that if DBC does not forward an agreement for execution by proposer within 90 calendar days from the proposal due date the proposer is released from its proposal and proposal bond.
