First African American Leads Salvation Army

Gen. Shaw Clifton, world leader of the Salvation Army, has welcomed commissioners Israel L. Gaither and his wife Eva D. Gaither as national commander and national president of women's ministries, respectively.

Israel Gaither is the first African American to hold the position in ministry's 126-year history.

"America loves The Salvation Army," he said. "There is strong confidence in who we are and what we do. But there's more to be done. This position is an honor and I intend to lead with total dependence on God and in partnership with territorial leaders to effectively impact those on the margins of American society. 
