## Father, Prized Boxer Dead at 62 Services Thursday at Emmanuel Temple

Services for Wade James "Papa" Smith will be held at 1 p.m., Thursday, July 20 at Emmanuel Temple Church, 1033 N. Sumner St.

Smith died July 7 at the age of 62. He was born on May 19, 1944 in Portland, Ore. to the late Arthur L. and Fentrice B. Smith. He was the fifth child and the only boy of eight children.

He received his education at Elliot Elementary and Jefferson High School. He worked as a laborer, and for a short time competed as a professional boxer. His first amateur fight was at the age of 14, where he won a match against a 21-year-old man who was in the Navy.

Wade was a "south paw," a lefty. If you were looking for the right, he was jabbing with the left. He was a two-time winner of the National Golden Glove Championship: one in 1962 and the other in 1963. In 2005, Wade was inducted into the Oregon Boxing Hall of Fame.

When Wade was born, his four older sisters couldn't believe their

mother had another baby and a boy at that. His sisters were so excited, that they went around the whole neighborhood knocking on doors telling people "We have a brother!" Momma wanted everyone to be just as excited as she was about her baby boy. Her favorite words and signature saying was, "That's my only boy."

As a young man Wade was industrious and would sell bottles to buy licorice for his mother. Later, instead of asking his parents for money, he would also sell bottles to go to Knott Street so he could box.

Wade loved his sisters and was very protective of them. While in hospice, he always told the nurses and social workers that his sisters would always be there for him and that he was rich; not monetarily but

because of the love of his family.

As much as he loved his sisters, he was just as much of a loving father to his five daughters. Like father, like son; all those girls!

His wife, Rose Beatty-Smith, preceded him in death. He is survived by his loving companion, Linda Adams,

who took very good care of him and was by his side as God dispatched a host of angels to take him to eternal life.

He also leaves to cherish his memory his daughters Darlisha, Loretta, Antoinette, Sarah and Sherice; two grandchildren; his sisters and a host of other loved ones, nieces, nephews and many friends.

An adopted brother, Halim Rashaan, another Knott Street boxer and Oregon Hall of Famer, died approximately 12 hours after Wade.
