



Black Leaders Urge AIDS/HIV Defeat

Bond cites failure to lead

(AP) -- It is time for the African-American community "to face the fact that AIDS has become a black disease" and find ways to defeat it, said the chairman of the NAACP at the international AIDS summit Monday.

Julian Bond, the Rev. Jesse Jackson and other powerful African-American leaders called on • their own community to accept responsibility for ending the devastation of AIDS, which has claimed more than 200,000 black Americans since the epidemic began 25 years ago. In a first for the political leaders, they blamed the disaster on a lack of will and pledged to do more.
