Sculptures Depict an Arduous Passage

Despair, strength captured by artist

Artist Aloisa Muvama has captured the raw emotion of a slavery passage to America in his internationally famed Slave Boats ebony carvings, on display with a collection of Makonde ebony sculptures at the World Forestry Center through Sept. 17.

Ebony (Dalbergia melanoxylon) is the one of the hardest and most valuable woods in the world. Most of us are familiar with its use on piano keys, but its versatility goes far beyond that application.

The bark of ebony is tan and generally light in color, while the sapwood is a soft white. It is the inner portion of the tree that is finegrained, dense, nearly black (blackwood is one of its common names), strong and heavy, and has been prized for centuries.

The rare ebony collection of approximately 60 pieces, on loan from Mr. Chaim Sil, includes the world's largest Makonde carving -



a 19-foot crocodile. Eagle's View Management Co. and West Coast Bank sponsor the exhibit.

The World Forestry Center Discovery Museum is a nonprofit organization located five minutes from downtown Portland in Washington Park, just off Highway 26. The Center is accessible by MAX light rail line.

General admission is \$7 for adults, \$6 for seniors, \$5 for children and infants two and under and free for members.

Artist Aloisa Muvama began carving his internationally famed ebony log slave boats in 1970. An ebony carving of a slave boat that weighs 900 pounds is on display through Sept. 17 at the World Forestry Center.




