Planetarium show opens at OMSI

There's a place from which nothing escapes, not even light, where time and space literally come to end. It's at this point, inside this fantastic riddle, that black holes exert their sway over the cosmos... and our imaginations.

The bizarre realm of a black hole is crossed in the Oregon Museum of Science and Industry's (OMSI) planetarium show, Black Holes: The Other Side of Infinity which opened Tuesday.

Viewers take a thrilling ride on the search for black holes across deep space. They encounter a range of spectacular cosmic wonders including a depiction of the beginning of the universe, the Big Bang, endless seas of dust and gas drawn together by gravity to form the first stars, the collision of two galaxies that cross paths in the vastness of space, and a virtual trip into the center of the Milky Way galaxy.

The exciting visuals are made possible by a unique software program and flight simulator that transforms real scientific data about black holes into stunning, colorful visualizations.
