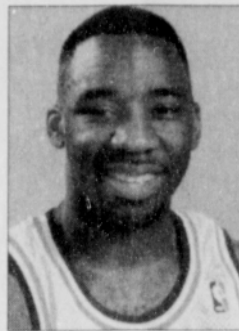

Brandon to Enter Hall of Fame

One of Oregon's best ever honored

Terrell Brandon, one of the best basketball players in Oregon sports history, will be enshrined as a member of the Oregon Sports Hall of Fame.

Brandon was high school basketball player of the year at Grant High School in northeast Portland, before becoming one of the best players in the history of the University of Oregon and a two-time NBA all-star.

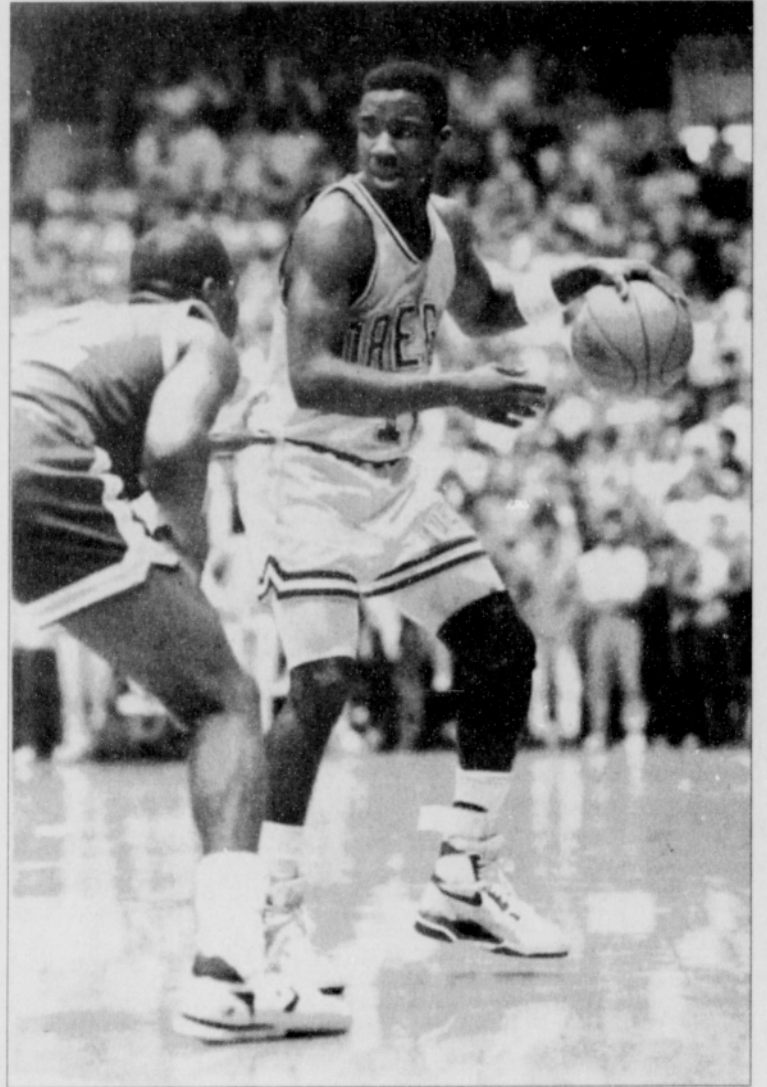
Other members of this year's class are broadcaster Doug LeMear, baseball player Wayne Twitchell, the 1965-66 Oregon State University Basketball team, Portland State University Coach Roy

record for single-game steals and was the league Most Valuable Player in 1990 and '91.

Brandon became the 11th overall pick in 1991 NBA draft. He played for Cleveland, Milwaukee and Minnesota in a professional career that saw him earn a spot on two NBA All-Star teams. He was the 1997 NBA Sportsman of the Year Award for community service. He had career averages of 13.8 points per game, 6.1 assists per game, and 1.6 steals per game.

LaMear was sports director for KGW-Channel 8 for 35 years. His love for sports began in his early days as a youngster at Portland's Llewellyn Grade school and as a baseball player at Benson high school.

Twitchell is a Portland native and three-year letterman in baseball at Wilson High School. He was selected in the first round of the 1966 draft by the Houston Astros and in 1970 made his major league debut against the Minnesota Twins striking out the side which included Rod Carew, Tony Oliva and Harmon Killebrew. He was a National League All-Star in 1979 pitching for the Philadelphia

Beavers defeated Houston and Elvin Hayes in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament before suffering a second round loss to Utah.

Roy Love attended Cleveland High School and Portland State University before beginning a coaching career at his alma mater in 1962. He coached baseball, football and golf as a professor of health and physical education at PSU for 30 years. In 1962 his baseball team placed 2nd in the NAIA Nationals and in 1967 his baseball team won the NCAA II Pacific Coast College Division Championship.

Judy Bochenki-Hoarfrust represented the U.S. in the historic

"Ping-Pong" diplomacy in China as a 15-year old, and again met the Chinese team in the 1972 friendship matches held in the United States. She competed on four U.S. World Championships teams in 1971, 1973, 1975 and 1977.

The Oregon Sports Hall of Fame will induct the six new candidates to join the nearly 300 current members during ceremonies at the Multnomah Athletic Club on Tuesday, Sept. 26.

This year's program will consist of a reception beginning at 5:30 p.m. followed by dinner and program at 7 p.m. Tickets are \$65 per person. To order call the Hall of Fame at 503-227-7466.

Brandon was born in Portland and led Grant High to the state title in 1988. At the UO, he earned career- and single-season records for scoring average, assists in a single game, and single-season steals (twice). He also holds the Pac-10

Phillies.

Barkley, Dumars Join Basketball's Hall

(AP) - Charles Barkley played the comedian during his induction into the Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Mass.

Barkley averaged 22 points and almost 12 rebounds in 16 NBA seasons that included stops in Philadelphia, Phoenix and Houston. But it was his charismatic personality and outspoken style that made him a superstar.

He put that style on display during the induction ceremony Friday night, with one liners about not finishing his college education and being arrested

several times.

"I was always acquitted," he said.

But there was a message behind the humor.

He made headlines in a 1993 Nike television spot, when he solemnly warned the audience, "I

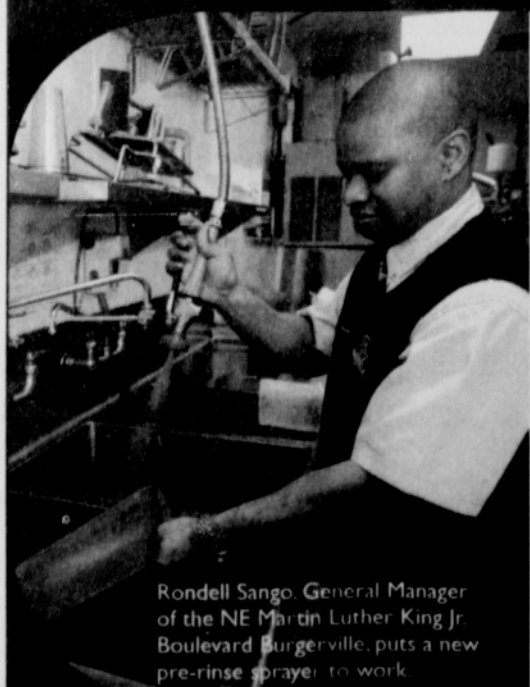
am not a role model. . . parents should be role models."

He said Friday that he was proud he started that conversation, and believes he is supposed to do great things with the fame that basketball has given him.

"Basketball is really important and significant in my life, but it's the least important thing," he said. "When I was able to give a million dollars to buy houses for the (Hurricane Katrina) evacuees, that was more important to me than anything I ever accomplished on the basketball court."

Barkley was enshrined with two other NBA greats, Dominique Wilkins and Joe Dumars, former Big East commissioner Dave Gavitt, Connecticut women's coach Geno Auriemma and Italian coach Sandro Gamba.

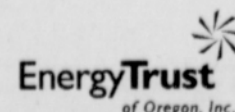

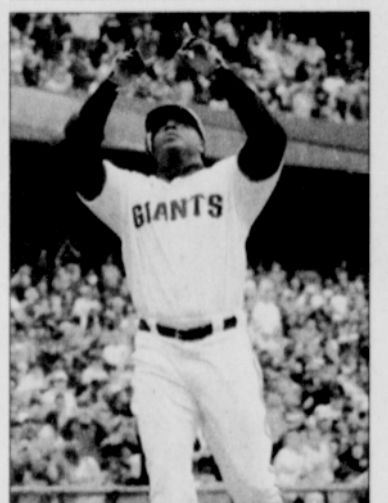
