World Forestry Opens Doors, Free on Saturday

On Saturday, Sept. 30, for one day only, museums across the country, including the World Forestry Center Discovery Museum will join the Smithsonian Institution in its long-standing tradition of offering free admission to visitors.

Visitors must present a coupon to get the free admission—the coupon can be downloaded at worldforestry.org.

Seven museums in Oregon and over 300 museums nationwide will extend free admission when presented with a Museum Day Admission Card. Each card allows free admission for two people and families can present more than one card.

The World Forestry Center Discovery Museum is a non profit educational institution dedicated to educating people about the

world's forests and trees. The museum underwent a \$7.5 million renovation in 2005 and offers family-friendly, fun, and interactive exhibits that engage visitors to learn about the sustainability of forests

in the Pacific Northwest and around the world.

The Discovery Museum is located in Portland's Washington Park off of Highway 26 at exit 72 marked Zoo/Forestry Center.
