Simpson's attorney, Yale Galanter, told The Associated Press: "We had known for three or four days that this

was a possibility. "There are only three possible reactions: anger, happiness or indifference. He's totally indifferent about the fact that it's been canceled," Galanter said.

He said he didn't know if Simpson was paid upfront.

Simpson was acquitted of murder in 1995 but was later found liable for the deaths in a wrongfuldeath suit filed by the Goldman family. Simpson has failed to pay the \$33.5 million judgment against him in the civil case. His NFL pension and his Florida home cannot legally be seized. He and the families of the victims have wrangled over the money in court for years.

The cancellation was a stunning profile imprint of HarperCollins and Judith Regan, who had labeled the book and interview Simpson's "confession." She insisted that she had done it not for money. but as a victim of domestic violence anxious to face down a man she believed got away, literally, with murder.
