Drug on North Interstate Avenue, carries Plan B for \$39.99 per dose. Hatch said he has sold it as a prescribed drug since it hit the market.

He explained that if a pharmacist decides not to carry it, they must refer the client to another pharmacy that does.

"And you can't do any preaching about why not to take it," he added, referring to a position statement from the Oregon State Board of Pharmacy regarding ethical and moral objections.

The board expects individual pharmacists to exercise his or her choice not to participate, but would consider it unprofessional conduct to lecture a patient based on moral beliefs. or otherwise interfere with their access to the medication.
