

Announcing the 2005-2006 Annual Diversity in Contracting and Workforce Training Report.

- Minority, Women and Emerging Small Business (M/W/ESB) utilization for construction was 20.1 percent, surpassing the 20 percent goal for a total of \$13 million. MBE construction firms accounted for 57 percent of the total utilization. The highest single category was African American-owned businesses at \$3.6 million.
- Minority and female workers totaled 23.97 percent of all construction hours.
- PDC exceeded its 20 percent apprenticeship goal with a rate of 26.7 percent.
 More than 24 percent of all apprentices were minority and female.
- Total PDC utilization of M/W/ESB firms was 19.1 percent toward the annual goal of 20 percent.
