For annual NAACP **Image Awards**

The musical "Dreamgirls" and the TV comedy "Everybody Hates Chris" have each collected a leading eight NAACP Image Award nominations. "Dreamgirls" star Beyonce Knowles led the individual nominees with five nods.

"Dreamgirls" was nominated for best picture and soundtrack, and six members of its ensemble cast-Jamie Foxx, Eddie Murphy, Danny Glover, Jennifer Hudson, Anika Noni Rose and Knowlesearned acting nods.

Inspiring Dance Film in Theaters

Story of life at historically black college

(AP) -- A film about black youth that doesn't focus on violence, gangs and life in the 'hood? Hard to believe these days, but it's possible

"Stomp the Yard," which opened nationwide Friday, is no cinematic epic. It's a lighthearted dance film and there's a lot of impressive



The 38th NAACP Image Awards ceremony will be held March 2 in Los Angeles and broadcast live on Fox.




