

Martin Luther King's Last Campaign

Author sheds light on race and class

Professor Michael Honey will discuss his new book, "Going Down Jericho Road: The Memphis Strike, Martin Luther King's Last Campaign, "Saturday, Feb. 17 at 1 p.m. at Powell's City of Books.

The San Francisco Chronicle said Honey's book "makes a crucial contribution to our understanding of our past - and helps us understand the racial and class landscape of America today."

ers died in their truck due to outdated equipment and the indifference of their white supervisors. Their deaths touched off one of the most significant labor strikes in the history of the nation, one that before its end would rock the plantation mentality of Memphis' government to its core and, on April 4, 1968, see the tragic death of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

Honey masterfully untangles the complex relations and events of 1968 with a scholar's eye and the passion of one who himself participated in the movement.

Honey is professor of African-American and labor studies and American history at the University of Washington Tacoma. He is a nationally-recognized expert on civil rights and labor issues.
