based educational testing company). Her career was then directed to serve as a community agent at Grant High School in 1970 where she worked for 17 years until retiring. After retirement, she successfully managed a fully staffed home day care center and foster care business for 8 years.

Verna had a passion for fishing, cooking and gardening. She spent countless hours fishing with her buddies and family members at many local fishing spots. She enjoyed cooking and had a special

touch in making barbecue ribs and took pride in making her

She was a long time member of the Morning Star Baptist Church and helped to usher in tutoring and mentoring programs in the church annex. She worked on the church planning committee that organized the building of the children's school adjacent to the church.






