Thousands Pay Tribute to Departed Bishop

Led Church of God in Christ

(AP) - Thousands gathered April 2 in Memphis, Tenn. to pay their final respects to G. E. Patterson, presiding bishop of the Church of God in Christ.

Patterson died of heart failure March 20 in Memphis. He was 67.

The COGIC leader helped grow the predominately black Protestant denomination to its

current size of about 6 million members worldwide.

Former President Bill Clinton spoke at Patterson's funeral at the Temple of Deliverance, calling the bishop a good and faithful servant who wished his faith would be known by his works.

Civil rights leader Jesse Jackson, NAACP Chairman Julian Bond and musician Isaac Hayes also attended.

A son of a bishop of the Church of God in Christ, Bishop Patterson was elected leader of

the denomination in 2000.

Known for his vivid sermons, Bishop Patterson spread the Pentecostal word through regular Sunday services broadcast on the Word Network, the Trinity Broadcasting Network and Black Entertainment Television. His own congregation, Temple of Deliverance, which he founded in 1975, had more than 6,000 active members in 2000.

At a 2005 church convention in Memphis, the bishop called on his membership to

spread the faith beyond racial and cultural differences. "I don't know why we ever got stuck on that thing that we're only supposed to give witness to black folks," he said.

Pentecostalism, one of the fastest-growing evangelical movements, teaches that people can be filled with the Holy Ghost in a second baptism.

Gilbert Earl Patterson was born in Humboldt, Tenn., on Sept. 22, 1939, a son of Mary Louise and William A.

Patterson. His father led churches in Memphis and later in Detroit.

Ordained as a church elder in Detroit in 1957, Bishop Patterson attended LeMoyne-Owen College in Memphis and the Detroit Bible Institute. In 1975, he founded Temple of Deliverance.

Bishop Patterson is survived by his wife of 40 years, the former Louise Dowdy; and three sisters, Mary Hawkins and Lee Ella Smith, both of Memphis, and Barbara Davis of Detroit.

To the Respondent:

- The petitioner has started an action in the above court requesting:
 - Custody of the children listed in paragraph 1.3 of the Nonparental Custody Petition.
 - The petition also requests that the court grant the following relief:
 - Determine support for the dependent children pursuant to the Washington State Child Support Schedule.
 - Order either or both parents to maintain or provide health insurance coverage for the dependent children.
 - Change the name of the child to: Weiderman
 - Change the name of wife to: Carlston.
 - Order payment of court costs and reasonable fees.
 - Enter a continuing restraining order.
 - Enter a domestic violence protection order.
 - Award the tax exemptions for the dependent children as follows:
- You must respond to this summons by serving a copy of your written response on the person signing this summons and by filing the original with the clerk of the court. If you do not serve your written response within 60 days after the dated of the first publication of this summons (60 days after the 16 day of March, 2007), the court may enter an order of default against you, and the court may, without further notice to you, enter a decree and approve or provide for other relief requested in this summons. In the case of a dissolution of marriage, the court will not enter the final decree until at least 90 days after service and filing. If you serve a notice of appearance on the undersigned person, you are entitled to notice before an order of default or a decree may be entered.
- Your written response to the summons and petition must be on form WPF DR 01.0300, Response to Petition (Domestic Relations). Information about how to get this form may be obtained by contacting the clerk of the court, by contacting the Administrative Office of the Courts as (360) 705-5328, or from the Internet at the Washington State Courts homepage: <http://www.courts.wa.gov/forms>
- If you wish to seek the advise of an attorney in this matter, you should do so promptly so that your written response, if any, may be served on time.
- One method of serving a copy of your response on the petition is to send it by certified mail with return receipt requested.
- Other: Take away parental rights of Elias and Reyna Morales from Victor L. Morales and Amber Morales.
