Death Caused by Beating Not related to car crash incident


A woman found dead in northeast Portland over the weekend is said to be a murder victim, Portland police say.

A screaming fight and a car crashing into a power pole were originally thought to be connected to the death of Sharvettia

Monique Brown, 37, whose body was found on Northeast 18th Avenue and Lombard Street around 4 a.m. on Saturday.

But an autopsy at the Multnomah County Medical Examiner's office ruled that Brown died from "blunt force trauma," not injuries related to a car accident.

Dear Miserable:


