

Program Offers Free Prescriptions for Poor

The Partnership for Prescription Assistance has passed its two year anniversary of focusing attention on patient assistance programs that provide free or nearly free medicine to struggling Americans who are uninsured or underinsured.

Sponsored by America's pharmaceutical research companies, the PPA says it has already helped more than 3.6 million people nationwide, with millions of additional people that could potentially qualify for assistance.

"We are 100 percent committed



to finding ways to help Americans live longer, healthier and more productive lives," said Billy Tauzin, President and CEO of the Pharmaceutical Research and Manufacturers of America.

Through a toll-free number (1-888-4PPA-NOW) and the Web site www.pparx.org, the PPA provides a single point of access to more than 475 public and private patient assistance programs that could offer help on more than 2,500 prescription medicines, including a wide range of generics.

If there are lots of chemicals or the list begins with water, by-product meat or grain, you know it's a bad food, she said.


She says the price of high-end and organic foods isn't as prohibitive as people assume.

"Yes, you will pay a little more

upfront for human-grade food, but they need less volume of food per day," she said. "Thear from customers consistently 'thank you so much, I don't have to buy as much food anymore."

Pet food retailers and medical experts all agree that if you decide to change your pet's food, it's best to go about it slowly - over three or four days - by blending the old and new foods together.






