### Saturday event spotlights local flavor

As one of Portland's largest street fairs, the north Portland event will close down the street from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. for dancing, shopping for unique goods made by local vendors, live music, great food and children's activities. Music will be featured on two stages - the Street Stage and the Station Stage - with artists booked by Jim Brunberg of Mississippi Studios.






