"It should be available within
the community, especially for
older citizens that consider long
distances a burden," he said.

As business picks up, Terry
is hoping to implement some
community activities into his
repertoire; like his idea to con-
tact the churches and invite
their community of widows on
a prepaid night at the opera,
and other such ideas that he
has been told are crazy. But
he isn't discouraged.

His community minded ap-
proach may seem unconven-
tional to individuals who be-
lieve that funeral homes are a
place that absorb the
community's money and bury
their deceased but Terry sees
opportunity to give back to the
community that gives to him.

"I don't want to go to my
grave saying there was some-
thing I should have done," he
said.
