

Class builds reality for small-business ideas

If you're looking to start you own business and find your way to a classroom tucked away in the Lloyd Center Mall, you might also find some reassurance.

The Small Business Development Center started during the early '80s when the state was in an economic recession. Since then, it has helped hundreds of people realize dreams to run their own businesses.


Most of the classes begin at 6:30 p.m., intended for those with day jobs. They had been working all day, but new life sparked in the eyes of students last Wednesday evening as Mario Pedraza began a participatory lecture on the considerations of starting a new enterprise.

Pedraza reviewed the basics at the outset: the importance of location, of finding a large customer base and the necessity of losing money during the first year. Then he made the class consider some of the more advanced topics like regulations.




