# Advocate Honored for Lifetime Work

Jean DeMaster, executive director of Human Solutions, has spent 35 years advocating for the impoverished, changing the face of homelessness services in Portland.

She was recently awarded the Gretchen Miller Kafoury Award for "outstanding achievement" from the Community Development Network for her long-term work in the field of community development.

Prior to Human Solutions, DeMaster spent four years as executive director of the YWCA of Greater Portland and 11 years as executive director of Transition Projects. At Human Solutions, she has overseen the development and acquisition of 175 units of affordable housing as well as an 11-unit rehabilitation project and the creation of 32 units of Permanent Supportive Housing. She is also leading the organization in the pre-development of an additional 220 units in two complexes slated to be completed in 2010.
