"We seek stories which are not only rich in puppet potential with fantastic creatures, talking animals, and magical elements, but stories containing life lessons for all of us," said Nancy Aldrick, Tears of Joy artistic director.
Such stories are incorporated in the theatre's current production of Anansi the Spider, based on folktales that originated in West Africa. Anansi might be considered an anti-hero haracter. His actions are not always motivated
by a higher purpose and he doesn't always succeed. He is just a little spider, often ridiculed by the other animals in his world. But he believes nothing is beyond his grasp. We may laugh at him, but he may just have the last laugh. The play is currently performed by puppeteers Ithica Tell and Amy Gray and the puppets were designed to reflect the African origins of the stories.
Performances are at the Winningstad Theatre, at the Portland Center for the Performing Arts, 1111 S.W. Broadway, and are accompanied by a lobby exhibit of art from Zimbabwe. Each of the vibrant pieces is accompanied by a description of the folktale that is illustrated and a picture of the artist who created it.
