2008 Ford Taurus Limited AWD

The 2008 Ford Taurus represents the resurrection of a name that has been a standard in the Ford stable of sedans for almost 20 years.

The Taurus remains a four-door, five-passenger vehicle. All Taurus models are outfitted with a 3.5-liter V6. The standard transmission across the line is a six-speed automatic with overdrive.

Bang down the throttle pedal and the new 3.5-liter V-6 with 263 horsepower in the 2008 Ford Taurus forcefully surges. It's not fast at 0 to 60 mph in 7.6 seconds, but it's in the game.

The new engine and transmission in the 2008 Ford Taurus are a wonderful team. The engine is extremely quiet and smooth at idle, and uses a pendulum mounting system that effectively separates its motions and vibrations from the rest of the car. It sounds healthy, powerful and smooth at full throttle, makes the car plenty quick in acceleration and passing situations, and settles down to a nice background hum in sixth gear, as it should. At freeway speeds, the Taurus is very, very quiet inside.

With its five-star NHTSA crash ratings, Ford is already calling it "the world's safest family sedan." Safety features include front, side and curtain airbags, ABS, and traction control. Electronic stability control is an option. With its Volvo-

like crash structure and features, the new Taurus has been awarded a Top Safety Pick by the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety (IIHS).

The new front end is dramatic and powerful. Ford's signature three-bar grille draws the Taurus into the family and adds machismo to the wispy wire mesh grille. The new front fascia gives it a more substantial look. The 2008 Ford Taurus is available in ten exterior paint colors and two interior trim shades.
