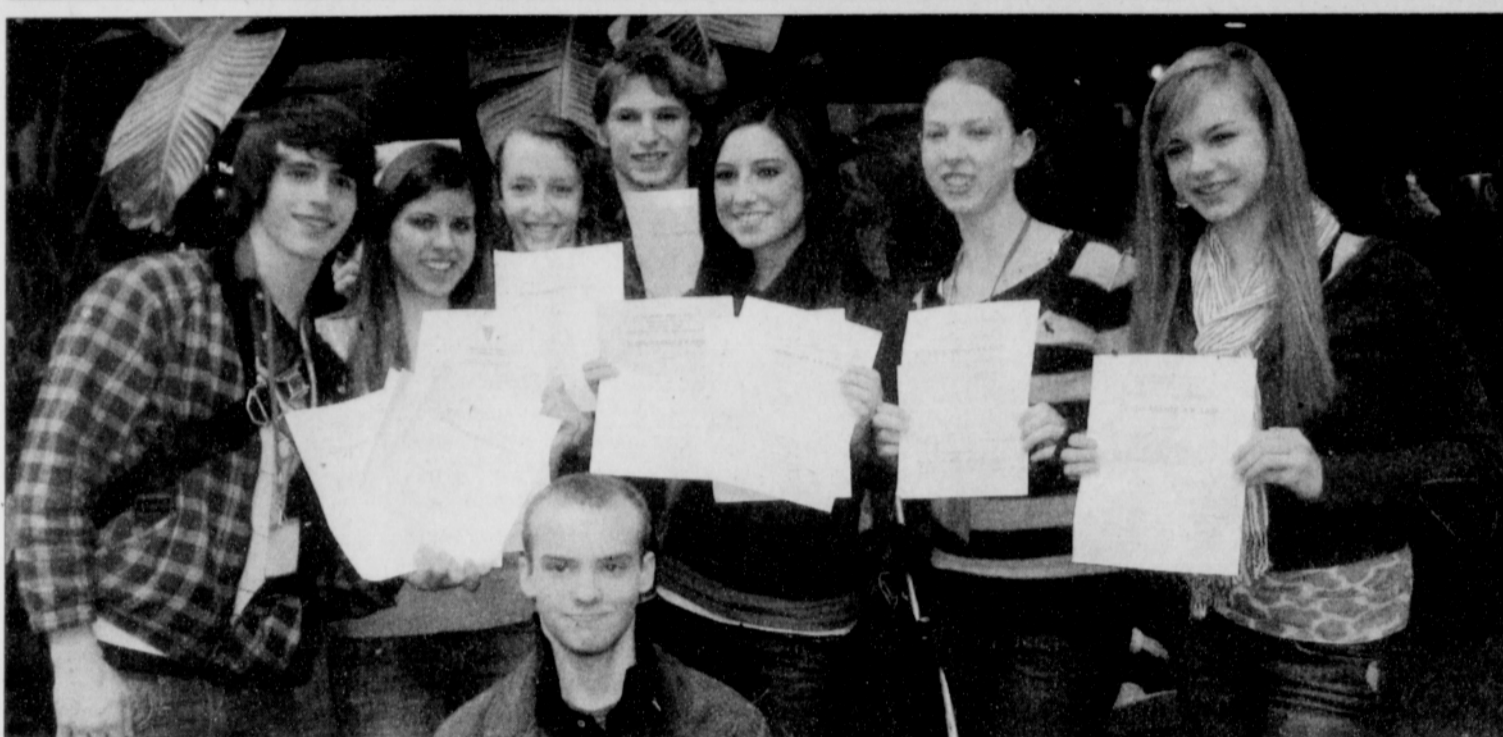

PSU Falls in NCAA

The best basketball season in Portland State history came to an abrupt end on Thursday afternoon in the Midwest. The 16th-seeded Vikings didn't have an answer for the talented number-one seed Kansas, losing 85-61 in the first round of the NCAA Midwest Regional at Qwest Center.

A quick start by Kansas came as no surprise as the Jayhawks got three early dunks and leaped to a 14-3 lead. However, once the Vi-

kings settled down and were able to run their offense, they got several easy baskets and some wide open three-point field goals. PSU got the advantage to 22-15 on a three-pointer by Tyrell Mara, then 24-18 on a three-point play by Deonte Huff at the 9:17 mark.

Kansas' lead grew to 25 on a three-pointer by Russell Robinson three-and-a-half minutes into the second half.

Portland State completed its season at 23-10, while the Jayhawks, 32-3, advanced.

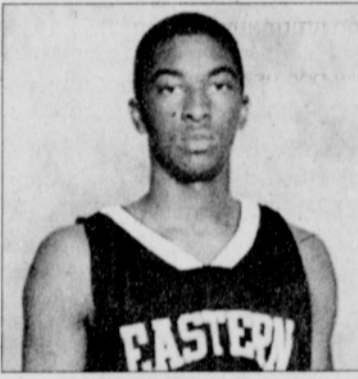


Portland State guard Andre Murray makes a play last week.

Jonathan "Smoove" Scott, class of 2007 graduate of Jefferson High School, helped Eastern Arizona Jr College to take 5th place in the country after a 70-63 victory Saturday at the 2008 NJCAA Division I Men's Basketball Tournament in Kansas.

Scott scored 15 points and made 14 rebounds in a total 44 minutes playing time off the bench during the four-day tournament. He had been named MVP of the Portland

Whitmore has served as president since 2003 of Texas Tech University, a campus of more than 28,000 students and an annual budget of \$580 million. He has built nationally ranked academic programs, raised research profiles, participated in statewide economic development, championed the concept of shared governance, and the appointment of women and minorities to faculty and administrative positions.

All three finalists will visit the PSU campus between April 2 and 10. Forums with students, faculty, administration and community leaders will be included in the schedule for each candidate, with the public-meeting schedule posted on the PSU website.

The State Board of Higher Education will interview candidates after the campus visits are completed, and expects to make a decision by early May.
