Showtime for the NCAA

A look at the Final Four

For the first time in NCAA history, all four No. 1-ranked teams advanced to college basketball's most-anticipated weekend.

Memphis will take on UCLA in the first semifinal this Saturday, April 5, followed that night by Kansas and North Carolina, with the winners facing off on Monday, April 7 for the national championship.

The Final Four teams have an unbelievable combined record of 143-9, and here's a look at each:

UCLA

Who's hot: You'd be hard-pressed to find many players that have had a better NCAA tournament than 6-foot-9 freshman Kevin Love, averaging 21.8 points and 11 rebounds in the Big Dance.

Pivotal player: Don't be surprised if Russell Westbrook bolts for the NBA. His athleticism gives opponents fits on the defensive end and often leads to some easy buckets in transition.


Best in the clutch: No Bruin makes bigger shots than junior guard Darren Collison, who kept his team alive in the NCAA tournament by making a high layup off the glass in the closing seconds of a two-point, second-round victory over Texas A&M.

Fast fact: This will be the third consecutive Final Four appearance for UCLA, which hasn't won a national championship since 1995.

Analysis: Even up-tempo, high-scoring teams such as Memphis struggle to put the ball in the basket against UCLA.

Record: 37-1.

Who's hot: Memphis' freshman point guard Derrick Rose is coming into his own at the right time. He averaged 20.5 points in his first four NCAA tournament games and may be the best player in the Final

Pivotal player: No Memphis player will be as important against UCLA as Joey Dorsey, whose match-up with Bruins forward Kevin Love will make for one of the more compelling semifinal story lines.

Best in the clutch: The guy who time and time again has made the big play down the stretch, guard Chris Douglas-Roberts didn't earn All-American honors for nothing.

Analysis: So much for that notion that Memphis was the weakest No. 1 seed in this year's tournament. The Tigers defeated their previous two opponents (Michigan State and Texas) by 18 points each.

NORTHCAROLINA

Record: 36-2.

Who's hot: Junior forward Tyler Hansbrough is averaging 21 points and 9.5 rebounds in the NCAA tournament, and he's scored in double figures in every game this season.

Pivotal player: Even though they kept winning, the Tar Heels weren't the same team when Ty Lawson missed six games in February with an injury.

Best in the clutch: Tyler Hansbrough's a force on the glass and is shooting 80.6 percent from the foul

Analysis: The Tar Heels averaged 93 points in their first four NCAA tournament games, which should make for a fun match-up against Kansas, a team that thrives in an up-tempo game.

KANSAS

Record: 35-3.

Who's hot: Sasha Kaun scored 13 points off the bench against Davidson on Sunday and has been the Jayhawks' best and most consistent post player over the past three weeks.

Most pivotal player: Kansas is a different team when Brandon Rush is at his best. He made just four
