Policing the Mortgage Business

As the foreclosure rate skyrockets nationally and locally, there are a growing number of predatory lenders, but there are also a growing number of groups trying to help people find a home loan without excessive fees.

Mortgage Police started in April 2007 to become advocates for consumers through the complete process of obtaining a home, from obtaining financing to the title insurance process.

"We make sure that they receive the best home loan they qualify for, not what will put money in the loan originator's pocket," said George Haskin of Mortgage Police.

Robbe Hardnette of Mortgage Police said "Education is No. 1."


